Reduce energy consumption in the U.S. Cost: \$50 billion to provide solar energy for 2 million homes and retrofit half a million homes for energy efficiency over the next five years	End subsidies to gas and oil industries. Net savings: More than \$60 billion over the next five years
Prevent the next wars. Cost: \$4.3 billion to take the next steps in 2013 to fully fund U.S. war prevention programs, to contribute to international organizations and peacekeeping, and to secure and remove vulnerable nuclear materials around the world	Bring home an additional 4,300 troops from Afghanistan in 2013, leaving more than 63,000. Net savings: \$4.3 billion (at approximately \$1 million per soldier per year.)
Reduce the federal debt by \$1.4 trillion over the next 10 years	End the temporary (2001 and 2003) tax cuts for wealthiest 2 percent of households. Net saving: \$830 billion and repeal the tax loophole for U.S. corporations' offshore profits. Net savings: \$583 billion.
