

Congress Votes Largest Military Budget Since World War II

On December 22 both houses of the U.S. Congress unanimously passed a bill authorizing \$725 billion for next year's Defense Department budget.

Add in what Homeland Security, Veterans Affairs, and the Energy departments spend on defense and total US military spending will reach \$861 billion in fiscal 2011, **exceeding that of all other nations combined**
