Our affiliate, the Palestinian Rights Committee, works for a just peace between Palestinians and Israelis based on equality, human rights, and international law. The committee supports Israeli and Palestinian peace activists working for reconciliation through nonviolent means.

Peace Is Possible

Advancing technology makes it possible to kill and maim more people in less time than ever before. War in developing nations is increasingly bloody, while war between technologically advanced nations would lead to mutual assured destruction.

Human beings can learn to settle differences without threatening to slaughter each other. Moving beyond war is now a necessity for survival.

We can strengthen the UN's international peacekeeping capability and work to shift resources from military purposes to meet real human needs. A reduced level of armaments worldwide would free up hundreds of billions of dollars to reduce hunger, disease, illiteracy, pollution, insecurity and resentment.

What You Can Do

Militarism can only thrive while people are willing to tolerate its excesses. The military industrial complex Eisenhower warned us against benefits only a small fraction of the public. Military spending produces fewer jobs per dollar spent than any other public program and diverts scarce research and development skills from constructive work.

We Advocate

Abolishing Weapons of Mass Destruction

The only way to ensure that genocidal weapons are never used by terrorists or nations is to abolish them under an effective verification system. The US needs to take the diplomatic lead to end this threat.

The US should act on its own to get rid of its own weapons of mass destruction. We urge the US to ratify the Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty, halt its Star Wars plans, reaffirm the anti-Ballistic Missile Treaty and support the Biological and Chemical Weapons Conventions.

Stopping the Export of Arms and Support of Juntas

We support an Arms Transfer Code of Conduct to bar all states from sending weapons and military aid to countries that violate human rights or engage in armed aggression.

We call for an end to US military training programs for foreign nationals. Graduates of the Army's "School of the Americas" have been infamous human rights abusers.

Using the Force of Law, Not the Law of Force

The international rule of law is the best way to prevent war and resolve conflicts. The US should stop blocking international disarmament and human rights treaties.
